- Candidates will use a variety of assessment tools and practices to plan and evaluate effective reading and writing instruction. Candidates explain assessment results and advocate for appropriate literacy practices to relevant stakeholders.
- Candidates recognize the importance of, participating in, and facilitate ongoing professional learning and coaching as part of career-long leadership roles and responsibilities.
- Candidates will apply theory and evidence-based practices to supervised practicum and clinical experiences.
