Brazil—Placements are available P-12 in English speaking classrooms through our partner institution American School of Rio de Janeiro.



China—Placements are available P-12 in classrooms in our partner institution, Shanghai United International School.



Costa Rica—Placements are available P-12 in English speaking classrooms in accredited bilingual schools through our partner institutions, Lincoln School and Country Day School (Guanacaste and Escazu campuses).

Your student teaching requirements are with international collaborating teachers in accredited schools in a supervised environment immersed in the rewarding cultures of **Brazil, China, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Madrid, Trinidad and Tobago, and Uganda!**

TEACHING REQUIREMENTS

Students complete 6 to 12 credit hours of student teaching in the grade and content area of their major registered Study Abroad. In addition, students would be responsible for registering for additional course work required by their program.

TEACHING RESPONSIBILITIES

Each teacher candidate is assigned to work with a collaborating teacher and will be supervised by KSU faculty in BCOE/EPP. Students teach for one semester. Student teachers complete a service project in their host country.

HOUSING

Housing will be arranged as home stays or shared apartments depending upon your host school.
