SEMESTER FOR SUMMER SEMESTER INTERNSHIP**

An Internship means you are registered for classes and working. The Co-Op program is different and has a different process through Handshake

- Graduate course: **CSE 7983 - Graduate Internship**
 - Serves as an **elective** for your Masters Program (MSIT, MSSWE, MSCS)
 - You must have an elective available; Course substitution is generally not going to occur
 - Need 9 Sem Hours in your major (6000 level course and above), GPA>3.0
 - International Students need 2 semesters complete (e.g. Fall, Spring)
- Undergraduate course: **CSE 4983 – CSE Computer Internship**
 - Usually serves as a major elective, concentration elective, etc
 - You must have an elective available; Course substitution is generally not going to occur
 - BS Computer Science must be on Catalog 2000 (previous catalogs don't allow)
 - Good standing and at least 30 Sem Hours with GPA2.5
- General
 - **Job** can be **paid or unpaid** and must be **related to the field of study**.
 - Academic Coordinator reviews and approves as part of process – you can get internship credit for one semester of you COOP. **You must work 150 hours a semester and you can only get 3 sem hours.**
 - **International students - Please review ISSS web site for CPT process and requirements. Here are some tips**
 - **Can start** work once the previous semester begins and you **must stop** day before the next semester begins.
Example Fall internship work would need to start **5 August 2024 and end 5 Jan 2025**
 - During **Spring/Fall** you can't work more than **20** hours per week
 - **Summer** you can work **40 unless last semester.**
 - Last semester you must have a F2F class (register for section 01 in Internship), etc.

CCSE Internship Process

An Internship means you are registered for classes and working. The Co-Op program is different and has a different process through Handshake

- You need an internship/job **offer**, the best place to start looking for an internship jobs is KSU handshake tool, <https://kennesaw.joinhandshake.com/edu/postings>
 - **Once you have an offer** , You will need to **apply** for an internship in the **Handshake experience tool**:
 - <https://kennesaw.joinhandshake.com/edu/experiences> - Insure you state you want an **Internship (and not a Co-Op)**
 - **Choose the correct experience template for your degree**
 - **Undergraduate => Major XYZ**, etc. you will see CSE 4983 otherwise you have the wrong template
 - **Graduate Students => Masters XYX**, you will see CSE 7893 otherwise you have the wrong template and be denied
 - I **review your education records** in degree works to insure you are eligible (see previous slide) and that the job description is valid to your degree
 - Your **work supervisor will need to approve in handshake – please ensure the supervisor/approver email/phone is correct.**
 - Once **finally approved**, then I will send you enrollment instructions to register. CCSE Advising will need to do the override.
 - **You can only take Internship course once!**
 - **Deadline to apply is listed here** <https://www.kennesaw.edu/careers/students/internships-co-ops.php>
 - **International students**
 - You will need to work with ISSS for the CPT/iStart. This is separate and after you are approved and enrolled in internship
 - **You can not extend your CPT at the end of the semester as your internship and CPT will end.**
 - If you want to work after the internship ends, please work with ISSS on pre-OPT or other process.
 - **ISSS is the authority on CPT** and other processes related to international students working in the US – **not CCSE**
