

## **Kennesaw State University Mathematics Competition**

## **Guidelines for Part I**

The KSU Mathematics Competition offers two options for administering Part I: **online** or **paper**. Please select only one option for your students.

## **General Instructions (for Both Options)**

- 1. **Materials Distribution**: Competition materials will be sent to the email provided during registration a few days before the contest date.
- 2. **Timing and Administration**: Part I must be completed in a single 90-minute session, scheduled at a convenient time during or after the school day.
- 3. **Supervision Requirement**: A high school staff member must monitor students throughout the 90-minute competition period.
- 4. **Content Coverage**: The questions cover high school mathematics up to (but not including) Calculus.
- 5. Calculator Policy: Calculators are not allowed during the contest.
- 6. **ESOL Accommodations**: ESOL students may use a dictionary or electronic translator during the competition.
- 7. Scoring System:
- Each correct answer earns **6 points**.
- Leaving an answer blank earns **2 points**.
- Incorrect answers or multiple answers on a single question earn **0 points**. Encourage students to avoid random guessing, as it may reduce their score.
- 8. **Question Papers**: Students may keep their question papers after the contest and are encouraged to discuss the questions once it has concluded.
- 9. **Post-Contest Access**: An electronic copy of the contest questions and solutions will be available on the competition website for approximately two weeks after the contest date: https://www.kennesaw.edu/csm/academics/mathematics/ksu-mathematics-competition.php
- 10. **Score Reporting**: Schools will receive their students' scores by the second week of December.
- 11. **Invitation to Part II**: Students scoring in the top 10% statewide will be invited to participate in Part II of the competition.
