GEC Minutes

Teams Virtual Meeting

March 16, 2021

- I. Attendance
 - Attendance was documented based on those members and guests who typed their name in the chat box to be recorded. *(Attendance attached.)*
- II. Approval of Minutes
 - Tom Doleys requested the attendance for the January 19, 2021 meeting be amended to show that he was present.
 - Trina Queen motioned to approve the amended January 19, 2021 minutes, and Joy Brookshire and Brendan Callahan seconded. The minutes were approved as written and with the amended attendance.
- III. Unfinished Business
 - The members were reminded that the colleges have been asked to confirm their curriculum committees' members, including the GEC, with Debra Hill by March 31, 2021. If anyone hasn't been elected or confirmed to continue as a GEC member, under the revised structure, they may want to check with their college.
- IV. New Business
 - Curriculum Proposals Update
 - a. MATH 1001 and DATA 1501 for Areas A2 and D1 have been approved by the USG.
 - b. ENGL and PHIL course deactivations have been sent to the USG.
 - c. CHEM courses are scheduled to be on the USG GEC May meeting agenda.
 - General Education Redesign is still paused. The draft proposed last year was never finalized and should only be considered as an indication of the direction the USG was going.
 - Curricular planning may require a timeline shift to build in the spring, review and approve during the fall (by KSU, and the USG, if required) in order to be included in the following fall catalog. With a shift such as this, GEC may be reviewing and voting in the spring on General Education items that need to be sent to the USG GEC in the fall, as the USG GEC has a limited meeting schedule.

Tom Doleys inquired if there was data available to drive substantial changes now (spring semester) for enrollment management. Kris DuRocher provided some examples. One example is the 10 credit hours in Area D. Being science specific, there is currently only one-pathway for non-stem students to achieve those 10 hours. Additional pathways need to be created for the non-stem students. Another example is to look at the most pressing areas that are causing bottlenecks or delays in student graduation (i.e. in Areas B2, C1 and D).

There was a strong interest for more information on the institutional and course models. The process for these models is similar, the biggest difference is where the students take the assessment. In the course model, the assessment is taken by the students in a GenEd curricular course (an introductory snapshot). In the institutional model, the assessment is taken by the students prior to graduating (a mastery snapshot).

Kris DuRocher provided information and examples from her discussions with and research on Auburn University and their approach. The GEC members in attendance continued to identify and discuss the positives and negatives of both.

Some of the questions still to be answered: "What kind of data is the institution looking for?"; and, "Where should the assessment take place?"

- GEC Fall Schedule
 - a. With the revised GEC structure, the GEC Executive Committee will meet on the 1st Tuesday of the month and the entire Council will meet on the 3rd Tuesday of the month in AY22.
 - b. The Executive Committee will set the agenda at their meeting for the following General meeting.





UNIVERSITY LEVEL GENERAL EDUCATION ASSESSMENT

- Example Auburn
 - Previously used course-embedded assessment approach
 - Not all faculty were using the common rubrics
- New model:
- SLOs for the core curriculum were foundational
- Assess and to measure it at mastery
- Seniors take the SCORE (Student Core Outcomes and Readiness Evaluation) the semester prior to graduating



AUBURN PROCESS

- Students are placed into a zero-credit course shell managed by Assessment Office
- Four components: SCORE, Diploma Application, Campus Engagement Survey, Final Destination Survey
- Results are shared with Core Curriculum and General Education Committee (CCGEC) faculty group and every department on campus. They are placed in a university dashboard
- Goal is to have entire university engaging in change and shaping all levels of program change
- Avoids a "check the boxes" mentality, reduces bureaucracy, reduces faculty workload

INSTITUTIONAL MODEL

Pros

- Workload is reduced for faculty
- Core curriculum changes don't result in other changes
- Captures all students (such as transfers)

Cons

- Distance from core curriculum coursework
- Difficulty in creating strategy for gaps in mastery

COURSE MODEL

Pros

- Easier to pinpoint revisions within the core
- Similar to KSU's previous model

Cons

- Requires faculty to give a common assessment and evaluate it
- Students can be missed (transfers) or take at any point in college career (compare seniors vs. freshman)
- Snapshot of student learning at foundational level, unclear how core connects to rest of curriculum


MOVING FORWARD

- Question remains about where should we be evaluating student learning
- Institutional level allows mastery but is more difficult to pinpoint change in general education courses
- Evaluating individual courses loses the ability to determine much other than how students performed at that movement in that course
