General UPCC Discussion

Cross-Listed/Cross-Leveled Courses Proposed Policy Discussion

A cross-listed course is a course that is offered under more than one departmental prefix.

- Courses must be within the same undergraduate or graduate numbering level.
- Courses must have the same credit hours, same syllabi, same objectives, same instructor, same modality (f-2-f,online or hybrid), same classroom space and time.
- Special Topics courses can only be cross-listed with an equivalent Special Topics course with another departmental prefix.
- Traditional independent study, honors thesis, practica, internships, directed readings, master's thesis, dissertation, etc. courses should not be cross-listed.
- Cross-listed courses must be supported by a rationale or interdisciplinary justification.
- No more than two courses can be cross-listed.
- Students cannot earn credit for more than one of the cross-listed courses.

A cross-leveled course is a course that is offered by departments across numbers and/or levels.

- Cross-leveled courses are limited to the following course numbering convention: 3000/5000, 4000/6000, 5000/7000, and 6000/8000. Nine-thousand (9000) level special topics, directed study, thesis, internship/practica, dissertation, courses may not be cross-leveled.
- Cross-leveled courses must be supported by a rationale or interdisciplinary justification.
- Cross-leveled courses must show different levels of rigor, with the higher number course being more rigorous. This will be demonstrated in 2 different syllabi that include, but are not limited to, different objectives, assessments and outcomes.
- Cross-leveled courses at the graduate level must be taught by faculty with graduate faculty status.
- Cross-leveled courses must share the same modality (f-2-f, online or hybrid).

Nihal Khote is presenting – their work produced the criteria listed above – various notes were added by members to inform the committee and to clarify these objectives – some notes: perhaps clearer to split bullet 2 into two bullets – one for Course and one for Section requirements;

Question from UPCC: Why 'no more than 2'?

Answer: This is a guideline from accrediting bodies, but not sure why, perhaps it confuses students with too much cross-polination;;; cross-leveling – why 3k with 5k, 4k with 6k, or example? Why not 4k with 5k? Perhaps delete bullet 1 sentence one (keep 2nd one)? They state that makes sense, will consider
