Meeting Minutes April 18, 20222

I. Welcome

Diana Honey, Interim Vice-President, called the meeting to order on behalf of the interim president James Stinchcomb. Diana requested that Joanne Lee manage the meeting as a previous president.

II. Approval of Minutes

Joanne Lee announced the review and further comments on the previous meeting's minutes. With no additions or comments being made Joanne Lee called for a motion to approve the previous meeting's minutes. Yvonne Wichman made the motion, which was seconded by Kenneth Sadeckas.

III. President's Update

- A. With no one attending the Faculty Senate meeting earlier in the day there was no update on the proceedings from that meeting.
- B. The comment was made that the parking situation is still an issue and resolving it is still in process. However, Joanne Lee has written to President Schwaig regarding the two issues of students parking fees and COLA while part-time faculty are still being asked to pay the full monthly fee for parking and not being considered for the COLA adjustment.

IV. New Business

- A. **Nominations:** Michael Perry, immediate past president, brought up the issue of upcoming election for officers, reviewed the current executive officer team, and discussed the nominations procedure. He also announced the email addresses of the current team and requested anyone interested in serving for the academic year of 2022 to 2023 to either nominate themselves or to have approval of anyone they nominate. Lastly, Michael Perry indicated that any nominees would have to submit a completed nominations package by April 26 to be considered officially.
- B. **Elections:** The election is scheduled to take place at the next meeting scheduled for May 2, 2022. Joanne Lee called for nominations committee to serve in the election process. Yvonne Wichman and Cleopatra Illiescu both volunteered to work with Michael Perry through this next election cycle.
- C. Other Committees: Joanne Lee discussed the Legislative Committee to work with Chuck Clay to do outreach to our Georgia Legislators. While Chuck Clay will head that committee Yvonne Wichman, Diana Honey, Ken Sedackes, and Terry Kersey volunteered to work on the Legislative Committee. Joanne Lee discussed additional committees that will be forming in the future based on the work that was done under her tenure as president. That work is relevant and ongoing.

V. Old Business

Department Representatives: Part of ongoing old business is to confirm future participation, and specifically, department representation. The attendees were asked to check with their respective departments whether they would be continuing to serve as representatives. Alternatively, if an attendee does not have a representative for their department, they were asked to communicate with their chairperson to either elect a representative or to be selected to serve.

VI. Announcements and Questions

A. **Cyber Security Training Due by 4/30/2022:** The deadline for taking the cyber security training was discussed and April 30, 2022, was the date designated by KSU to complete the training, otherwise part-time faculty run the risk of being locked out of access to KSU computing services and email.

Yvonne Wichman asked where the training is located, and Mandy McGrew announced that the cyber training module could be found in OwlTrain under the UITS landing page. The location would be under: uits.kennesaw.edu, then find the Faculty/Staff quick link, followed by the OwlTrain link.

B. **Update from CETL:** Mandy McGrew made a point of mentioning the deadline and the associated risks of not completing the cyber security training. Mandy also mentioned that all CETL programs are done for the semester and the fall schedule is not available yet. There might be some summer semester opportunities, but that information was not available yet, either.

There was a question regarding what documentation might be needed for migrating from part-time to full-time employment. While the chances are not likely for that kind of a move, Mandy McGrew mentioned that she would be happy to help anyone develop their teaching portfolio if anyone wanted to be prepared for full-time applications. Joanne Lee suggested to Mandy McGrew that developing a teaching portfolio might be a good future training event for part-time faculty, Mandy indicated that these tend to be individualized and might not be appropriate for a meeting training event.

- C. **Meeting Schedule:** May 2, 2022 will be the next meeting. That will be our last meeting for the semester and the academic year. Next meetings will be in the fall. That schedule is currently in the process of being formulated.
- D. **Payroll Calendar:** The next two payroll deadlines are April 20 and May 19. These dates are also available on the Part Time Faculty Council website.
- E. **Questions:** Chrystal Blalock asked if anyone knew what the maximum size of online classes was supposed to be. Several remaining attendees indicated they are different for each college and department, but that they have gone up in size over the last several semesters. Terry Kersey indicated that we might want to visit the definition of how a part-time faculty is designated. Joanne Lee suggested that that was something to discuss in the Legislative Committee.
