### Meeting Minutes March 21, 20222 http://ptfc.kennesaw.edu

#### I. Welcome

President James Stinchcomb called the meeting to order @ 3:30 pm. He announced that the Council is trying to meet via teams to increase access, and he reviewed the protocols for PTFC meetings.

#### **II. Approval of Minutes**

Joanne Lee asked for corrections or additions to the minutes as published. None were suggested. Yvonne Wichman made the motion to approve the minutes of the January meeting as published, and Ginger Stinson seconded the motion. The minutes were approved as published.

#### **III. President's Update**

- A. President James Stinchcomb addressed issues arising from the Teams platform and access to the chat for representatives and for faculty who teach part-time who join the meeting. He will look at correcting these items prior to the next meeting. One step that attendees can take is to follow the link that James sends out and join the TEAM.
- B. President James Stinchcomb provided an update from the Faculty Senate meeting.
  - 1. Interim President Kat Schwaig has been appointed at President of KSU. On behalf of the PTFC, James has officially congratulated her.
  - 2. Ranking of Applicants Policy Resolution Verbiage on ranking and hiring by departments is being reviewed across colleges for consistency and alignment with KSU initiatives.
  - 3. CRT Language regarding Academic Freedom Questions about academic freedom in the CRT resolution were answered. President Schwaig summed up the position that academic freedom does not isolate or discriminate against any person or group. It promotes inclusivity.
  - 4. Support for Ukraine Faculty requested a statement of support for Ukraine. President Schwaig explained that scholarships and visas are available to support students.
  - C. Provost Ivan .... Supports the Faculty Senate . . . Established committees . . . No invitation to serve on committees is extended to part-time faculty or lecturers as they are not paid for this. This eliminates the voice of faculty who teach part-time.
  - D. Topics for Next Meeting Members recommended reaching out to instructional support for technology personnel for assistance. Helen Maddox was named as an expert source.

### **IV. New Business**

- A. Nominations for Officers In response to the resignation of President Michael Perry, James Stinchcomb has assumed to role of President and Diana Honey will serve as Interim Vice-President. President Stinchcomb has asked Michael Perry to establish a nominating committee of five to seven members to fill the positions of President and Vice-President. Members interested in serving should send James and email.
- B. Committees for PTFC Goals President Stinchcomb identified the three areas that the PTFC is working on as Policy and Compensation, Shared Governance and Inclusion, and Communication. Members were asked to actively engage and sign up for the committee they are willing to serve on by sending him an email. He affirmed that this information should be sent to all faculty who teach part-time as the positions are open to all members. The suggestion for the communication to come from the representatives was accepted.
- C. PTFC Statement about the Union President Stinchcomb has been contacted by the Union for Campus Workers and asked for information on faculty who teach part-time. The Executive Committee discussed the request and determined that in would be in the best interest of the PTFC as a sub-committee to the

Faculty Senate to maintain a neutral stance on the union. Member is the Union is a personal and confidential matter. He encouraged members to follow their beliefs.

- D. Parking There were conflicting reports from faculty who teach part-time in terms of ability to find parking spots. The time of day was a factor in finding spots. James will follow up with the theyparking committee. Survey results will be made available to elected representatives, but the results are not for public distribution.
- E. HB910 University and state employees K-12 will receive a \$5,000 pay raise. Part-time faculty were included in K-12. James will follow up to find out what this means for faculty who teach part-time at KSU. Representative Chuck Clay will form a committee to make a plan to address this issue.

### V. Old Business

- A. Representatives No new department representatives were identified.
- B. Parking Parking is an ongoing issue. James is trying to get a date to meet with the committee. Representative Ginger Stinon suggested a temporary parking pass for part-time faculty to attend meetings. James will bring this up to the committee.
- C. Training Continue to access Owl Train. PTFC will seek support via KSU personnel.

### VI. Announcements and Questions

- A. Update from CETL CETL Liaison Mandy McGrew shared that the Spring Workshop for Faculty Who Teach Part-Time has 30 applicants and 18 were selected to participate. No workshops relevant to PTFC are offered the rest of this year. Walt Justice asked about the approach to RSI. Mandy will get back to the Council on this. Yvonne Wichman asked about the possibility of having another SPACE conference. Mandy explained that funds had been cut. James stated that he hoped that the PTFC could collaborate with CETL for a virtual conference.
