WHAT DID AMES DO?

In December 2022, Dr. Brian A. Moore presented as the Keynote speaker at the Army Medicine Senior Leader Forum at Joint Base San Antonio, Texas. About 500 senior military leaders who shape policy for military medicine attended this presentation, which summarized data on health conditions that impact readiness across the force.

HOW DOES THIS APPLY TO MILITARY, VETERANS, AND EMERGENCY SERVICES?

Leaders, both in the military and emergency services settings, face complex and dynamic problems. These require flexibility and willingness to learn. In many cases, a leader can spend too much time fixating on a problem, while missing opportunities to focus on what is more prevalent or more impactful. Ongoing research by AMES highlights where leaders can focus their attention to improve health, readiness, and performance.
