  - Seeks proposals that integrate AI into a project with substantial community impact
  - up to \$150,000 for one-year projects
  - Applications open February 1st—April 30th, 2024
- NIH Notice of Special Interest: Health Influences of Gender as a Social and Structural Variable
  - Multiple mechanisms available through multiple institutes/centers
  - Possible due dates: Jan 24, 2024 through Sep 30, 2025
