Composition Pedagogy, Conspiracy Theory Rhetoric, and Rhetorical Empathy. Her recent dissertation, Identifying with Conspiracy Theorists: Uncovering Rhetorical Questions in the QAnon Movement, explores the complex rhetorical strategies employed in modern conspiracy theories. In her latest composition course, Al and YOU: Welcoming Our Robot Overlords, Dr. Harte examines the intersection of Al and human experience, engaging students in thought-provoking discussions on the role of technology in society.
